Stamp your tack

Horse riders are being urged to get their tack security marked for free.

Tack marking is regularly carried out free by Horse Watch volunteers in a bid to deter thefts from stables across Oxfordshire.

If property is marked and then stolen and recovered, the police are able to return it to the correct owner.

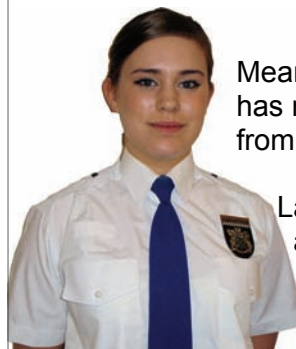
